

### Report of the Programme

Today, on 02/12/2019, a Departmental Seminar is held in the Department of English at 11-30 A.M. at the Conference Room of Barbhag College, under the chairmanship of Prof. Ajit Kumar Sarma. The topic for today's seminar is "Post Independence Indian English Poetry." A total of 27 students and 3 teachers participated in the seminar. The speaker in the seminar is Mrs. Nivedita Goswami who has delivered a lecture on the above mentioned topic.

At the very beginning the Chairperson Prof Ajit Kumar Sarma announced the name of the speaker i.e. Prof. Nivedita Goswami and explained the aims and objectives of the seminar. He gave the students a gist on Indian English poetry during the post-Independence Era and asked the speaker to deliver her speech.

Prof. Goswami began the seminar with a brief explanation on the background to Indian English poetry. She said that poetry is the expression of human life from times eternal. In the initial phase or the first phase of Indian poetry was the period of literary renaissance in India. Derozio's poems Kashiprasad Ghose's poems, Michael Madhusudan Dutta's 'The Captive Lady' are a testimony to the creative upsurge occasioned by the romantic spirit killed by the literary Renaissance. The poets of the second phase were Sarojini Naidu, Rabindranath Tagore, Aurobindo Ghose and Harindranath Chattopadhya. The poetic output of these poets was prolific. Romanticism of these Indian poets was fraught with nationalism spirituality and mysticism. It was therefore different from English Romanticism. The ethos of the post-


Independence phase of Indian English literature is radically different from the first two phases, when the question of political Independence was resolved in 1947 with the partition of India, the tensions of the Indian psyche suddenly relaxed. In this new spirit and confidence the Indian poets found themselves in line with modern English and American poets. Mrs. Goswami concluded her lecture by pointing out the importance of Indian English poetry in the post –independence Era.

At the end of the Seminar, some of the student participants asked some questions and the speaker Mrs. Nivedita Goswwami answered their quarries. It was a good interactive session and the seminar was a grand success. The programme ended at 2-00 P.M. with Prof. Anupam Dutta offering the vote of thanks to everyone.



















### Seminar on Writing of Research Paper

#### Report of the Programme

Today, the 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2020, a popular lecture programme is organized by the department of English on the subject "T.S. Eliot and the Metaphysical Poetry." The programme is held in the Departmental Class room of the English department. Altogether 39 students and 4 teachers of the department of English have participated in the programme. The programme commences at about 11-30 A.M., and the proceeding starts with a brief introductory speech by Mr. Sarma, Associate Professor, Department of English, Barbhag College. In his introductory speech Mr. Ajit Kumar Sarma has applauded the initiative of his department for organizing this lecture programme and briefly recounts the great contributions of the Metaphysical Poets to the sphere of English poetry. Mr. Sarma has made special mention of John Donne's fantastic poetic ability in composing a class of poetry which was beyond the tradition of the then contemporary English poetry.

After that the invited guest and resource person of the programme Dr. Ranjana Bhattacharyya has delivered her scholarly deliberation on the topic. Dr. Bhattacharyya, in her speech, highlights the primary aspects of T.S. Eliot's criticism on the 17<sup>th</sup> century Metaphysical Poets with reference to their exceptional poetic ability. The key points of her discussion are the concepts like- "the unification of sensibility", dissociation of sensibility", "mechanism of sensibility", "metaphysical conceit" etc.

By 'Unification of sensibility', T. S. Eliot means 'a fusion of thought and feeling', 'are creation of thought into feeling', and 'a direct sensuous apprehension of thought'. Dr. Bhattacharyya explains how T.S.Eliot argued that the Metaphysical poets, together with the Elizabethan and the Jacobean dramatists, had a mechanism of sensibility which could accommodate any kind of experience. Eliot points out to Donne's most successful and characteristic effect secured by brief words and sudden contrasts: A bracelet of bright hair about the bone, where the most powerful effect is produced by the sudden contrast of associations of 'bright hair' and of 'bone'... This telescoping of images and multiplied associations were characteristic of some of the dramatists of the Elizabethan period like Shakespeare, Middleton and Webster, and is one of the sources of the vitality of their language. She further states that the poets of the seventeenth century (up to the Revolution) were the direct and normal development of the preceding age. However, a dissociation of sensibility set in after the age of Donne, in the late 17th century; there was a split between thought and feeling. The influence of Dryden and Milton has been particularly harmful in this respect.

Dr. Ranjana Bhattacharyya is of the view that Eliot's 'dissociation of sensibility' was a result of the natural development of poetry after the Metaphysical poets, who had felt "their thought as immediately as the odour of a rose"; this phenomenon—the "direct sensuous apprehension of thoughtEliot gave evidence of the dissociation of sensibility in the more elevated language and cruder emotions of later poets.

The lecture programme finally concludes with an interactive session with the invited guest and a good many students also share their knowledge.
