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### Memorandum of Understanding

Between

Barbhag College Kalag, Nalbari, Assam

And M.N.C. Balika Mahavidyalaya Nalbari, Assam

With a view to promoting cooperation and collaboration in matters relating to education and research on the basis of reciprocity and mutual benefit for both the colleges, this Memorandum of Understanding is hereby signed between, Barbhag College, Kalag and Nalbari College, Nalbari. The areas of collaboration, cooperation and association shall include faculty exchange, student exchange and student support and Research collaborations. The primary objectives of this MoU are to facilitate faculty members in both the institutions to experience teaching at a broader platform, to enhance their teaching skills by sharing knowledge, and to benefit by collaboration in different areas of research. Further, the MoU will also benefit the students of both the colleges through mutual access to resources in both institutions.

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The MoU is signed by Phanidhar Deka, Principal, Barbhag College and Dr. Krishna Chandra Goud, Principal, M.N.C. Balika Mahavidyalaya

(a) The MoU will encourage the following cooperative activities, in particular:

- Policy dialogue to regularly exchange information and experience on education challenges and reforms, and to identify priorities for bilateral cooperation in the field of education and research.
- Exchange of information on their respective educational systems and policies to assist in ongoing education reform and to facilitate the student/staff mobility.
- Exchange and professional development of officials, academics, scholars, teachers, experts, students and administrative staff.
- Collaboration between the education institutions in curriculam delivery and research programs and publications, including exchange of research materials, publications and educational literature.
- Organisation of joint conferences, exhibitions and symposia on matters of mutual interest.
- Arrangement of requisite infrastructure and other professional activities for faculty members as per need of the institution.
- Student exchange program, whereby students in both institutions could be benefited by having access to learning resources in each other's institutions.

(b) The cost of cooperative activities may be funded as mutually determined. All cooperative activities under this MoU will be subject to the availability of funds of the institutions.

- (c) This MoU may be amended by mutual written consent of the colleges.
- (d) This MoU will come into effect from the date it is signed.
- (e) This MoU will remain in effect for an initial period of 5 (five) years and may be extended, on mutual consent, for successive periods spanning not less than one year.
- (f) The MoU may be terminated by mutual agreement of both institutions. However, under no circumstances, termination can take place less than one year after it is signed.

# **Faculty Exchange Program** Organized by Department of History Barbhag College and Mahendra Narayan Choudhury Balika Mahavidyalaya, Nalbari

## Date: 02/11/2017 Venue: MNC College

Department of History of Barbhag College, Kalag, Nalbari, conducted a Faculty Exchange Program, for the 5<sup>th</sup> semester student in the History Department MNC College Nalbari. For the Exchange program, Namita Devi, HOD, History Barbhag College, as a Resource Person conducted one hour class for the students of 5<sup>th</sup> semester MNC College. The class started at around 2pm. The focus of the lecture was on "Commercialization of Agriculture in Colonial India". The lecture session covered the topic of commercialization of agriculture during British Rule, its negative and positive impact in Indian Society. She lectured on how the various economic policies of British led to the rapid transformation of India's economy into a colonial economy whose nature and structure were determined by the needs of the British economy. She then goes on to explain that when industrial revolution was gaining its pace in England, commercialization of agriculture started in India. It became prominent in an around 1860. The main aim of such policies was not to feed the industries of India but was done primarily to feed the British Industries. She says that every policy have a positive and negative effects. She highlighted the negative impact of commercialization of agriculture such as exploitation of poor as the poor peasant was forced to sell his produce just after harvest at whatever price he could get as he had to meet the demands of government moneylenders and his family requirement. It also led to loss of land if the peasant failed to meet the demand the land came under the ownership of money lender. Some of the positive impact of commercialization of agriculture was that the commercialization linked India with the world economy, it led to the introduction of large number of commercial crops such as tea, indigo, cotton, coffee. She concluded the lecture by saying that the commercialization of agriculture was a new phenomenon in Indian society introduced by British from which the upper section of the Indian society was benefitted and the peasant life was tied to remote international market. The worst effect of commercialization was the oppression of peasants at the hands of Europeans and rich moneylenders. The one hour session came to an end at around 3pm with more new knowledge for the students.
