ONE-DAY INTERDISCIPLINARY WORKSHOP ON INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (IPR)

Organised By
IQAC, Barbhag College
Date: 10th January, 2022

Keeping in view the importance of Intellectual Property Rights, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Barbhag College has organised a one-day interdisciplinary workshop on Intellectual Property rights (IPR) on 10th January, 2022. The workshop was held by keeping in mind the restriction imposed by the district administration due to the outbreak of the third wave of COVID-19. Though limited in numbers, faculty of different colleges attended the workshop. At the beginning of the workshop, the Keynote address was given by Ajit Sarma, HOD, English Department of Barbhag College and the welcome address was given by Nivedita Goswami, Principal-in-charge of Barbhag College. Dr. Dhaneswar Baisya, Associate Professor of Political Science department chaired the sessions of the workshop.

The workshop was divided into two technical sessions. In the first session, Siddhartha Devnath, Scientist 'C', Patent Information Centre, Assam Science, Technology and Environment Council (ASTEC) was presented as the Special guest, who graced the occasion with his vast knowledge on the discussed topic of the workshop. The topic of his speech was "Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and Patent". Describing Intellectual Property, he said that the intellectual properties are those things that are created in mind and expressed in some form or other. It must have the proof of ownership and should be recognised under the act of law. He cited the examples of light bulbs, pen, jewellery, etc as intellectual property. Elaborating ideas on intellectual rights, he also mentioned some forms of intellectual property, like inventions, designs, mark used in trade-brand name, mark used in goods to show its geographical origin, layout designs of integrated Circuit (IC), new varieties of plants, and literary, artistic, musical creation as well. He also talked about the rights enjoyed by people under intellectual property, like rights to enjoy the owner of an intellectual property, right to exploit, license, assign, surrender etc as the owner. Talking about the different types of intellectual property, he also mentioned the legislations enacted by the Government of India for maintaining intellectual property. Examples of such legislations are The Patent Act (1970), The Design Act (2000), The Trademark Act (1999), and The Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection act, 1999) etc that play key

role in maintaining intellectual property ownership. By imparting his knowledge on one of the major concepts of intellectual property i.e. "Copyright" he mentioned about patent and also about its significance for owners. He described patent as a legal grant of exclusive rights for an invention (product or process) provided by the government to the creator of a new and useful invention. Under the Patent Act of 1970, the inventor gets patent rights for a period of 20 years. He also elaborately discussed some criteria of patent, like novelty, inventive step, industrial applicability etc. In his speech, he also made a difference between the inventions that can be patented and those which cannot be patented. At the end, he talked about the different stages of patent from application to grant, fees and process of patent.

After a short break, the second session of the workshop began. Dipen Deka, Assistant Professor, Department of Library and Information Science of Gauhati University was the special guest in this session. The topic of his speech was "Copyright". He discussed copyright mainly in relation to literary and fictional creations. To him, the copyright procedure in India is maintained by the Copyright Act of 1957. He mentioned that people can cite other's works with proper acknowledgement and prior permission of the owner of the copyright for research or private study, for reporting current events and in connection with judicial proceedings. He identified the creators who are given copyright rights. Those are: a music composer, a film producer, a sound producer, a photographer and also an author who creates literary works. He also mentioned that copyright is also assignable for future work too. The term of copyright in literary works is 60 years and the performer's right is 25 years. Again, he also talked about "Plagiarism" and what causes plagiarism and advised people the method how to avoid the fault of plagiarism.

A total of 40 participants from various colleges took part in this one-day workshop and made it a huge success.

The current devastating floods in Assam have hit thousands of families across the state, particularly in the lower and middle Assam districts this year on June and July. Nalbari is one of the worst affected districts and the villages under Barbhag Development Block are the ones that have suffered severest of damages. At this devastating time of flood, the college fraternity has taken a month-long relief initiatives and programme and sustenance the suffering people of the neighbouring community following the motto - "May humanity always win against all odds!".

At the end of the programme President Mrs. Prativa Deka, delivered her speech and she also emphasized on house sparrow conservation. 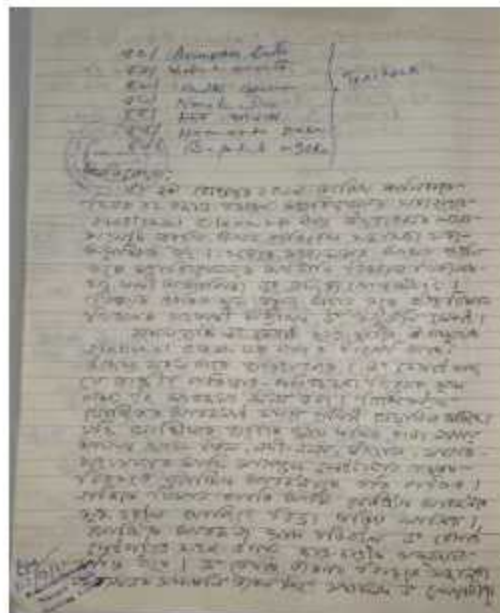

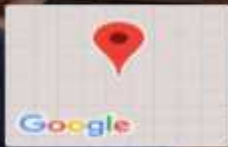

The Proceedings in brief:

The two days National Seminar was organised by the Department of History, Barbhag College scheduled on 21st & 22nd January 2022 and rescheduled due to Covid protocol which was held on 11th and 12th February, 2022 with the Title of *“August Kranti Movement and Its Multi Faceted Dimensions in Assam reflected in the Freedom Struggle of India”* sponsored by Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR), New Delhi at the Barbhag College Premises.

India is now celebrating 75 years of its independence from the colonial regime. It is the time to commemorate the sacrifices of those martyrs and great soul as well those phases of hardship which could be the spirit of inspiration for the new generation. History is a preserver of the record and analysis of human civilization and freedom struggle is one of the

important phases that make the very existence of today's India as a Nation. Thus history has to keep those phases in its order for future generation as a spirit of inspiration.

Assam, an integral part of the Indian Nation has entered into the nationhood during the colonial period. It is situated in the north eastern borderline of the greater India geographically and has been touched by the colonial hegemony of the British somewhat lately by 1826. Having the connectivity of Assam with the greater India, it has been inspired by the each and every resistance endeavour of the Indian people against the British and the heroes of this corner of India also selflessly did engage, lead and sacrifice in all the sphere of the Freedom Movement.

This seminar has provided a platform to commemorate the martyrs of the Indian freedom movement with its multifaceted dimensions and locating August Kranti Movement particularly in Assam and placing it in the history of freedom struggle of India in general with a holistic approach of history writing. The seminar has given an opportunity to draw out the picture of the August Kranti Movement at the micro level and helps to find out unsung heroes of each and every corner of Assam. The impact and participation of Assam in the various facet of the movement that leads us to an inclusive history of freedom struggle and energize the new generation of each and every corner of India with the great legacy of martyrdom of their soil. The Book exhibition of ICHR, NERC that we invited and organised along with the seminar had helped in popularising the subject and successfully attracted the students in this sphere of knowledge.



Inaugural Ceremony

As the Inaugural Session started at 10 A.M. on Day one, the guest and participants of the seminar were welcome with a morning message by the Co-ordinator Dr. Namita Devi at the very beginning and then the seminar was started with the lightening of the lamp followed by an inaugural session. Dr. Birendra Deka, President of Governing Body and Dr. Birinchi Choudhury, Principal of Barbhag College lit the inaugural lamp along with all dignitaries present in the session with 'Deepa Stuti' performed by Dr. Namita Devi, Coordinator of the seminar. The Session was hosted by Dr. Anupam Dutta, IQAC Co-ordinator of Barbhag College. The Inaugural session was started by a patriotic song '*Viswa Bijay Na-Jwan*' performed by the students of Barbhag College and the lyrics of the song was written by renown laureate and freedom fighter Jyotiprasad Agarwala. The welcome address was given by Nivedita Goswami, Vice Principal of Barbhag College and in her address she highlighted the importance of the topic to the young generation. She also said that our nation not only having to face the external enemies but a lot of internal detractors as well. So knowing our nation with its strength and weaknesses, the study and research in historical facts are very important. In her speech, she highlighted the importance of August Kranti Movement which was a mass movement in the true sense against the British and mentioned that the participation of Assam in the phases of August Kranti where the Britisher's saw the might of the Assamese people. She also briefed up about the College and welcomed all the dignitaries and participants gathered for the seminar with a humble request to bear with the shortcomings of the institutional infrastructure. Dr. Sanjib Goswami, in his talk as Chief Guest discussed that "An important aspect of the Quit India movement was the way the movement was implemented. This was designed and implemented through various programmes in a pyramidal structure... The role of the subalterns and the protests of the marginalised and people in the fringes were ignored. Any activity that did not fall within the pyramid structure set up by the Congress was considered against the spirit of the movement. It is for this reason that any form of violence such as those relating to the Chauri-Chaura incident, the derailment of the train in Morigaon, the martyrdom of many in Assam including Kushal Konwar, Kanaklata Barua, Bhogeswari Phukanani, Rebati Lahon, Kahuli Devi and several others do not find mention in the national historical narratives of the Quit India movement. This therefore gives us further scope to research the neglect of events in the periphery like Assam or of those by the marginalised and subaltern people. As the Azadika Amrit Mahotsav is

being celebrated, this seminar should also research into a critical analysis of the Quit India movement in the light of international historical protests worldwide. The events in South Africa against apartheid, the Russian Revolution, the two nation resolution of the Muslim League in 1940, as well as the visit of Veer Savarkar to Assam in 1941, just prior to the Quit India movement are all events that hold much research potential and thus throws light on the multidimensional aspects of the Freedom Struggle in general and Quit India Movement in particular. Dr. Barnali Sarma, Associate Professor, Dept. of History, Gauhati University as a key note speaker highlighted about the importance of the phase and said that 'as the seminar is on the August revolution we need to question what is so very specific of the movement. The seminar also attempts to probe into its multifaceted dimensions in Assam. So here I would like to set a pen picture of the time on which the scholars will address the different issues and of course with different perspectives in this two day seminar. Quit India or Bharat Choro are the simple but powerful slogan which launched this legendary struggle which we also call the August revolution. The quit India movement was started in a situation when Great Britain was engaged in a life and death struggle for its survival against the Axis power comprising Germany, Italy and Japan. Cripps mission who came with British war cabinets' proposal on Indian question too failed as it did not carry any hope of independence after the end of the war. The situation in Assam was also critical as it was a frontier province. During this period it was in the grip of three terrible crisis- (1) the police repression consequent on launching the quit India Movement for freedom and independence (2) the economic and social dislocation caused by the imperial war effort coupled with the Japanese aggression and evacuees problem and (3) the famine problems and its impact on the life and activities of the people of the province. She also said that the Quit India movement though it did not bring independence in its immediate result, but it lowered the prestige of the colonial regime and shattered the so called invincibility of Great Britain'.



The First technical session of the seminar had begun after the inaugural session. The session was started with the moderation of Sanchyita Khakholar, Assistant Professor, Dept. of History, and Barbhag College. The chairperson to this session was Dr. Sanjib Goswami, Professor and Head of the Centre for North-East, Mahapurusha Srimanta Shankardeva Vishwavidyalaya and the resource person was Dr. Akunthita Barthakur, Associate Professor, Dept. of History, and Cotton State University.



Dr. Akunthita Barthakur as the resource person talked about the Assamese people and their sacrifices made during the Quit India Movement. The session had a total number of eight papers. The first paper was presented by Phulrenu Mishra, BBK College and the theme of the paper was "August Kranti Movement: Struggle and Sacrifices (with special reference

to Barpeta District). Again Barasha Barman, M.A. student of Gauhati University presented her paper on "People of Barnagar during Quit India Movement". Then we have Jayshree Singha, presenting her paper on the topic, "August Kranti or Quit India Movement of Assam. The title of the other paper presented in this first session were "Contribution of Unsung Heroines of Quit India Movement 1942 from Darrang District of Assam"; 'Gandhian Nationalist Movement and Raja Rao's Kanthapura', the Role played by the Student of Cotton College, Assam during the August Kranti' etc. The papers presented in this session has been highlighted and locate the participation of Assamese people of the micro level area of Assam in the August Kranti Movement and put forward the mass people representation in the Quit India Movement.



The Chairperson and the resource person gave their comments and advised the paper presenter. Dr. Goswami talked about how to write a good research paper and advised to follow research format in writing research paper. Dr. Barthakur pointing out the lacunas of each paper, advised the paper presenter to write a good research paper by following the proper methodology such as putting foot notes, references etc. The second technical session has begun after a short lunch break with the moderation of Monalisha Brahma, Assistant Professor, Dept. of History, and Barbhag College. Dr. Bhaskarjyoti Sarma, Associate professor, Anandaram Barua Institute of Language, Art and Culture, North Guwahati was the Chairperson of this session and the resource person was Dr. Akunthita Barthakur. This session had four research papers on different sub-themes related to Quit India and August Kranti Movement.



The first paper presenter was Pratyasha Takuldar, presenting her paper on “Role of language, literature and Culture in the August Kranti Movement with emphasis on Jyotiprasad Agarwala”. Dr. Jamaluddin Ahmed, Assistant Professor, Chamariya Anchalik College, presented a paper on “Role Language, Literature and Culture, in the Quit India Movement of Assam”. The next paper presenter was Rafat Subayyil who talked about the “Role of Mrityu Bahini , the death Squad of Assam. The Last paper of this session was “the Role of Tea tribes in Quit India Movement in Assam “ and was presented by Pranab Jyoti Phukan.



At the end of the Session, Chairperson Dr. Bhaskarjyoti Sarma analysing the whole session and put forward his observation on doing good research and urged the researcher to

do research narrowing the scope of the study. He advised that the presenter should be careful in selecting the theme; to narrow down the topic, again he said the researcher should be clean in the way that it may have impact for a longer period of time.



The second day of the National seminar began with 3rd technical session, which was moderated by Dr. Anupam Dutta Co-ordinator of IQAC, Barbhag College. The session was started with a speech of Dr. Kamal Nayan Patowary, Principal, Nalbari College on the role of August Kranti Movement in Historical Research.

A total number of five papers were presented in this session. Noopur Singh, Assistant Director, ICHR, New Delhi presented her lecture as one of the Resource person on “26th September, 1942 Remembering Unsung Heroes of Mrityu Bahini, Assam” through online mode. Then Bedika Bhattacharyee , Researcher of Gauhati University presented her paper on “August Kranti, Gandhian and the Rise of Feminist Nationalism in Assam”. Emphasising the ‘Role of unsung heroes’, Abdul Rouf and Tilak Sarma, presented their paper on “Sahidur Rahman: The First Assamese Martyr of Azad Hind Fauz”. Sumi Das on her paper highlighted the Role of Women in August Kranti. The last paper of this session was presented by Abu Shama Ahmed, Moriom Nessa and Abida Ahmed. The theme of their paper was “the Role of Assam in Historic Quit India Movement”.



At the end commenting on the papers presented, Chairperson Dr. Kamal Nayan Patowary indentified the scope of historical research in present day context. Resource person Dr. Rabin Sarma, Principal, Damdama College talked about history of the Freedom Struggle to be analysed from the Indian perspectives. Monalisha Brahama, Assistant Professor Dept. of History, has delivered vote of thanks in this 3rd technical session. After short tea Break of 15 minutes, the Valedictory session was started. This session was presided by Dr. Birinchi Choudhury, Pricipal Barbhag College, Nivedita Goswami, former Pricipal i/c and Vice Principal Barbhag College. The Session was hosted by Dr. Chandan Kalita, Assistant Professor, Dept. of English Barbhag College. The Valedictory lecture was given by Vice Principal Nivedita Goswami, where she highlighted the outcome of the seminar. She referred that the seminar has explored the history of Quit India Movement of Assam indicating the various aspects such as unsung heroes, local contributions, unsung heroes of Azad Hind Fauz and above all the involvement of women in a large and prominent scale in this phase of Freedom Struggle. The President of the Rapporteur Ajit kr. Sarma read out the Report of the two days Seminar and reviewed the outcome of the seminar as a whole and then certificates were distributed to the paper presenter. With the vote of Thanks given by Dr. Namita Devi, coordinator of the seminar and the Seminar had been closed down with the National Anthem by all the people of Valedictory Session.

Note of Resource Person

Every year June 21 is observed as an international yoga day, declared by the United Nations and the credit goes to India for introducing the draft resolution in the UNGA on December 11, 2014. In this connection, the draft resolution received an overwhelming support by 177 member nations, which is said to be the highest in the UNGA for any resolution of such nature. Although, the initiative taken by India should have come long before, given the rich cultural history the country enjoys in yoga sutra and the yoga philosophy, which is also known as an abode of yogis, who practice and teach yoga for physical, mental and spiritual well being. But as is said, better late than never, so holds true of declaring June 21st as the International Day of Yoga. By helping declare June 21 as an international yoga day, India has got an added responsibility to ensure that yoga is practiced and preached in every nook and corner of the world, which is battling for peace and tranquility. India has to play a very proactive role in drawing awareness at the global level towards the need and importance of practicing yoga, especially in the modern day world, which is full of stress and strain, when life has got more mechanized. Yoga is a *Sanskrit* word which means to join or to unite, symbolizing the merging of inner-consciousness with the supreme consciousness. The yogic practices are said to be over 10000 years old, however, the evidences of yoga practice can be traced as early as 5000 years ago in the Rig Veda, the oldest sacred texts. The Patanjali Yoga Sutra is deemed to be the first systematic yogic compendium and is often referred as the father of yoga philosophy or the yoga sutras, wherein discussion lasts around eight limbed path towards attaining the Samadhi. As per dictionary meaning, the word yoga refers to practice aimed at training the consciousness for a state of perfect spiritual insight and tranquility that is achieved through the three paths viz., action, knowledge and devotion.

In this year, the Govt. of India observes the yearlong 75th years of celebration of India's freedom movement by adopting whole year programme on AZADI KA AMIRIT MAHATSAV, on this regards the ICPR, New Delhi have also taken the different programme under this banner in the utmost respect of the Azadi Ka Amirit Mahatsav, the Barbhag College, Kalag, Nalbari has taken the International Day of Yoga programme on

30th June, 2022. Today, we are happy to participating in the Yoga programme. Yoga is a system of exercises practiced as a part of the Hindu discipline to promote control of the body and mind. Yoga helps to rejuvenate the body and prolongs the life. It is a process whereby by a person can cleanse his/her body and mind. The richness of a culture is always traced by looking at its longevity and prevalence of its practice in a society and to enrich this culture there is always need to promote and propagate this culture both within the society and to the outside world. Besides, the knowledge is about sharing and making others aware of things and practices of which they are unaware. The aim should always be to let things move from the haves to the have-nots, and so holds true about movement of knowledge or yoga. There is utmost need that teaching, preaching and practicing of yoga should move outside India for the wider benefit of humanity and for that practicing yogis of India need to travel outside India on the similar lines what Swami Vivekananda marched to the west with. Some common health benefits of yoga: - It is said that a regular practitioner of yoga not only keeps diseases at bay, but also prolongs life. The irony is, almost every second person on the earth suffers with one of the other kind of medical conditions and so do people keep on experimenting with their bodies with different kind of medicine despite knowing the ill or side effects of the medicine. Contrary to it, people, despite knowing very well the health benefits of yoga and its positive side effects chose medicine over yoga. Although there are numerous health benefits of yoga, but still some common benefits which a person can reap by practicing yoga on a daily basis include. Yoga is one of the best stress busters; practicing yoga regularly not only helps in preventing from diseases, but also helps in recovering from ill health. Yoga improves flexibility of the body, helps to build and tone up muscles, perfects the body posture, prevents cartilage and joint breakdown, protects the spine, improves bone strength, helps to regulate the blood pressure, boosts immunity by improving draining of lymph's, regulates heart rate, blood sugar, improves memory, enhances decision making ability and helps in maintaining good energy levels throughout the day. Yoga helps to improve the agility of the body, helps in maintaining a healthy nervous system, improves sleeping abilities and reduces depression.

Apart from the physical benefits, yoga also helps in fine tuning the psychological problems in a person. Yoga helps one to remain healthy and happy, helps in developing a

good and healthy lifestyle, helps in relaxing the body and rejuvenating the worn out tissues. Helps in giving the much needed peace of mind, increases self-esteem, given inner strength, one becomes conscious of changes and transformation which yoga brings into one's body, helps in improving and leading a happy family life, improves all round fitness, helps in fighting with the weight loss, stress free life, inner peace, improved immunity, living with greater awareness, increased energy, better intuition and more. Beginners who intend to practice yoga asanas (sitting) should always do it under the guidance of someone who is familiar with yoga asanas and their advantages and disadvantages. One has to follow every precaution while practicing yoga asanas, mostly depending upon one's state of health. Yoga has its own advantages, but, if a person is not in a good state of health, practicing yoga asanas, not advisable for one may further aggravate one's health. So, it is always advisable to first know the state of your health and then know your asanas, which are good for your health. Pranamaya is the exercise of breathing, what people generally are familiar with. The exercise of breathing may appear simple to practice while seating in a lotus asana, but the intensity and vividness involved in the breathing while performing pranayama in different states has to be equally taken care of, as any attempts towards pushing one's body beyond normal limits may prove harmful. Some major pranayama yoga forms are i) Anulom Vilom Pranayama ii) Agnisar Pranayama iii) Bahya Pranayama iv) Bhastrika Pranayama v) Bharamari Pranayama vi) Digra Pranayama vii) Kaapalabhati Pranayama viii) Nadi Shodhana Pranayama ix) Shitali Pranayama x) Udgit Pranayama xi) Ujjayi Pranayama.

Since most of the yoga practices are directly associated with the breathing, hence helps in improving the health of the lungs. Yoga improves the conditions like ulcer, digestive system, irritable bowel, constipation, eye sight etc. On June 21, 2017, the world is about to observe the 3rd international yoga day. More and more people have started realizing the importance of the yoga and so is India gearing up to make this year yoga day more memorable with more and more public participation. This year, more and more public participation is expected all across the world. There is need to understand that yoga is not about this particular day, but is something which people need to imbibe in their routine life. Practicing yoga on the international yoga day will not turn a person into a follower or believer of yoga philosophy. People have to make it sure to practice yoga on a daily basis for at least 30 to 40 minutes a day. To reap the maximum health benefits of yoga, it is advisable that one should practice yoga preferably early in the morning, given the follow up routine day activities, however one can practice pranayama at any point of time as per one's suitability. The Prime Minister Narendra Modi played a very significant role in declaring June 21 as an International Yoga Day by the UN. It was Prime Minister Modi, who on September 27, 2014, in his speech to the UNGA proposed the idea of having an International Yoga Day. Prime Minister Modi in his speech said at length about the benefits of Yoga, a gift of Indian ancient tradition. The Prime Minister Modi told the august gathering that how Yoga helps in the embodiment of mind and

body, thought and action, restraint and fulfillment, harmony between man and nature, health and well being and how yoga helps in developing the sense of oneness with the body, mind and the nature. It won't be inappropriate to say that in the present times Prime Minister Narendra Modi is the global ambassador of the yoga philosophy. Prime Minister Modi hasn't just reached out to its own citizens in drawing awareness about propagating, preaching and practicing yoga, but like a devotee follower of the Swami Vivekananda, Mr. Modi is committed to reach out to the masses all across the globe with his vision of making yoga a global phenomenon. While proposing June 21 as the International Yoga Day, Prime Minister Modi ji was well aware that the day has cosmic significance. The time is rated as suitable for the spiritual harvesting. It is believed that it was on this very day when the Lord Shiva the first yogi began imparting the knowledge of yoga to the mankind. The other cosmic significances of the day is that it marks the transition to Dkashniyan, which means when the days in the southern hemisphere start becoming longer and shorter in the northern hemisphere, followed by Guru Poornima, the first full moon after the summer solstice. It would be quite unfair to not to mention about the present day yoga guru of India Baba Ramdev. Baba Ramdev is a staunch believer and advocator of the yoga philosophy, who with his firm belief and devotion has taken yoga to every doorstep of the country. Baba Ramdev in his endeavour to spread the message of yoga not only succeeded in drawing awareness among the masses about the yoga and its physical, psychological and spiritual benefits, but is being seen as a man who succeeded in drawing crowds to his yoga camps, both within and outside the country. It is not that yoga was completely forgotten or not practiced in the India, but as was pointed out by Shri Shri Ravi Shanker of the Art of Living that without state patronage yoga was surviving like an orphan. The practice of yoga was prevalent, but was going around silently among few Ashrams, which too were sharing the benefits of yoga only among their followers and not among the common masses. Even the difficulty with such yogis was that they were unable to entice people towards yoga and to their yoga camps. This limited awareness about yoga was somewhat working contrary to the true ambitions and purpose of the yoga. Baba Ramdev, made people realize that how yoga can help in bringing the much needed change in the life of an individual. The move towards declaring June 21 as the international Day of Yoga was almost hailed by one and all, all across the world in general and the yoga gurus across India in particular. These yoga gurus hailed the personal efforts put in by the Prime Minister Narendra Modi towards the deceleration of June 21 as an International Yoga Day by the United Nations. Sri Sadhguru of Isha Foundation termed the move more scientific towards the inner well being of individuals. Similarly, Sri Sri Ravi Shanker of the Art of Living apart from lauding the efforts of Prime Minister Modi, also said that how difficult it is for a any religion, culture or philosophy to survive without state patronage, but with the UN recognition, the world is bound to witness the benefits of yoga. India is a very vast country, having over 1.30 billion people, practicing different faiths, following different

ideologies and to tie them all in a common frail thread is impossible. Thereon, people in India lack scientific temper as such, most of the time look at the things from the religious perspective, with the result they always end up making issues out of nothing by giving them the religious colour. Practicing yoga in India is being opposed by some religious groups, only because they propagate yoga as a practice, which belongs to Hindus and non-Hindus should refrain from doing any yogic practices. This is very unfortunate that the people who belong to this yogic land, have forgotten about their own rich culture and values, and those who have started adopting the western lifestyle, should remember that the west has started embracing yoga with open arms and the International Yoga Day corroborates this fact. In this regards, the department of History Barbhag College is organized the 8th International Day of Yoga on 30th June 2022 sponsored by Indian Council of Philosophical Research, New Delhi. Due to heavy flood in the college premise the event is postponed to 30th June 2022.
